

■ Night lights in hallways and bathrooms



9 Basic Ideas from AARP


■ Replaced light bulbs with higher wattage





Avoid lighting with glare

■ Replaced faucet knobs with levers



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9 Basic Ideas from AARP

■ Replaced door knobs with lever handles





■ Replaced your phone with one that has larger numbers



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9 Basic Ideas from AARP

■ Installed emergency response system



■ Install non-slip strips on stairs





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9 Basic Ideas from AARP

■ Use double sided tape to secure carpets or rugs





■ Placed non- skid strips on bathtub or shower





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Home Evaluation Centered on "Client-Activity"

- What activities does the client want to do?
- How can the environment be adapted to allow engagement in the desired activity with the greatest:
 - **◆** Independence
 - **◆ Safety**
 - **◆ Satisfaction**

Identify Desired Activity

- What does the client want to do they are currently unable to do?
- What activity is the client doing which is causing pain, discomfort or some type of risk?
- Is the client getting satisfaction from their daily activities?

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Identify Strategies

- Change the way the activity is done.
- Identify assistive devices
- Make structural changes to the home

Positive Outcomes

- Positive outcomes are more likely when both the client and the planner understand:
 - ◆ The abilities of the client.
 - ◆ The array of assistive devices available
 - ◆ The possibilities of universal design and home modification
 - (knowledge of ADA standards is only a starting point but frequently not effective in the home situation)

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Built in oven with side opening






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Kitchen - Roll out shelves



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Ease burden of standing

The standing stool relieves 90% of the weight from the legs and feet while allowing a client to be at a good working height.

Caution: this stool tips easily if moved at an angle.



Off set door hinges

Avoid expensive reframing of doors by changing hardware.





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Does it Make a Difference

- Phone Study
 - ◆ Phone use increased by 50%
- Effectiveness Study
 - ◆ Less pain
 - ♦ Able to do more
 - ◆ Less Hospital days (average \$17,000 less)

How to get it done.

- Do it yourself
- Community Agencies or Church Groups
- SHIPP funds
- Contractors (most need consultation to insure a good result)
